A story of Okinawa Lunar New Year

In Okinawa, before Japan conquered Okinawa, Okinawa always had new year celebration same as China, Lunar New Okinawans were always trading with China. Today, some villages still celebrate Lunar New Year. Where my parents were born in one of the small island, till today they celebrate Lunar New Year at this lime stone cave, you walk 108 steps up the mountain, and they dance and sing which it's open only on Lunar New Year. Way back before anybody can go in the cave, every day, but people being broken the stalactites and damaging the cave so now it's open only on Lunar New Year. The first time I went to Okinawa, we have to climb up the mountain and the next time, people from Hawaii donated money and they built the steps (108 steps). I did visit the cave several times and it's very cool and there's a figure of a women and they believe if you cannot conceive you pray and you will conceive. My aunty went and she did conceive.

Now the cave is only open on Lunar New Year because people damaging the stalactites. The cave is a limestone cave and they believe the Gods were living in the cave. Today it is a tourist spot.
